## Inside ESC

### – ESC Office and Lounge Munich



During the ISSF General Assembly Munich end of July 2010, the European Shooting Confederation opened its ESC Office and Lounge in the Hilton Meeting Hotel Munich to inform on the activities of our confederation, especially in the field of shooting sport media and TV productions.

During this time ESC President Vladimir Lisin – who was elected as member of the ISSF Administrative Council – was available for personal talks and consultations.

Additionally he presented the latest ESC promotional videos as well as a special 3 D TV-version of the European Shotgun

Championship Kazan. All these videos had been produced with high speed cameras (2.000 frames per second) which allow a never seen production quality and resolution.

The videos show impressively the dynamic and drive of shotgun shooting and are highly attractive for a broad TV audience. Moreover the most up-to-date technical possibilities allow the complete electronical target tracking and scoring.

Many ISSF delegates, representatives of the ESC- and ISSF-member federations as well as a lot of guests took the chance to visit the ESC Office and Lounge in the Hilton Park Hotel Munich and to watch the thrilling videos.



ESC President Vladimir Lisin already announced that further promotion videos and TV productions are planned in cooperation with the sports channel Eurosport.

The present [shotgun TV spots](#) will be on air at least until end of this year.



## – World Championship Munich 2010: European Results and Records

During the closing ceremony, ISSF Vice-President and Technical Delegate Garry Anderson underlined that the World Shooting Championship Munich 2010 were the best championship of its kind ever. In total [27 world records](#) were tied or set in 15 Olympic and 40 non-Olympic events during the Munich Championship. 35 nations finished on the podium, [321 medals](#) were awarded to the lucky winners. The shooters of the ESC member federations were most successful: 207 medals were awarded to them (Asian Shooting Confederation: 82 medals, Americas: 28 medals, Oceania: 4 medals).

Finally [69 Olympic quota places](#) for the Olympic Games London 2012 were distributed to 26 countries. The most successful ESC federations were again Russia (9) and Italy (6) followed by Germany (4).

Georgi Nekhaev, responsible for the European Ranking List of the European Shooting Confederation, prepared a comprehensive overview of the European records during this World Shooting Championship 2010:

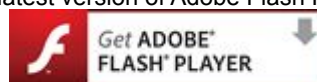

### – Youth Olympic Games Singapore (August 14<sup>th</sup> - 26<sup>th</sup> 2010)

From August 14<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> 2010, the first Youth Olympic Games take place in Singapore. About 3.600 young athletes between 14 and 18 together with 370.000 spectators join these Games in 26 different sports, culture and education programmes.

## Fight against Doping

### – WADA „Play True Generation Program“

The World Anti Doping Agency informed that on the eve of the inaugural Youth Olympic Games (YOG) in Singapore, August 14–26, WADA was set to officially launch its Play True Generation Program. The Program, which was piloted during the 2008 Commonwealth Youth Games in Pune, India, challenges young athletes to be a generation of clean athletes.



Just as its Athlete Outreach Program is a staple of Olympic and Paralympic Games Villages, WADA's Play True Generation Center, located in the [Village Square at the heart of the Singapore Youth Olympic Village](#), will be a place for athletes, coaches and entourage to learn more about anti-doping in a relaxed, fun environment.

For many athletes, the YOG will be their first experience with doping control and discussing anti-doping issues. The Play True Generation Center will be a place where athletes feel comfortable to ask questions and associate anti-doping with a positive experience.

“The Play True Generation Program will be an unique experience for WADA and the young athletes attending these Games,” says WADA's Director General David Howman. “This is our future generation of champions and sports leaders, and these young people will one day be at the forefront of the fight against doping in sport. The YOG is an excellent forum for engaging them in spreading the message of clean sport when they return home.”
